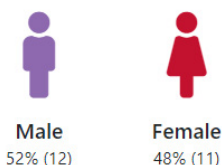


Sample Report

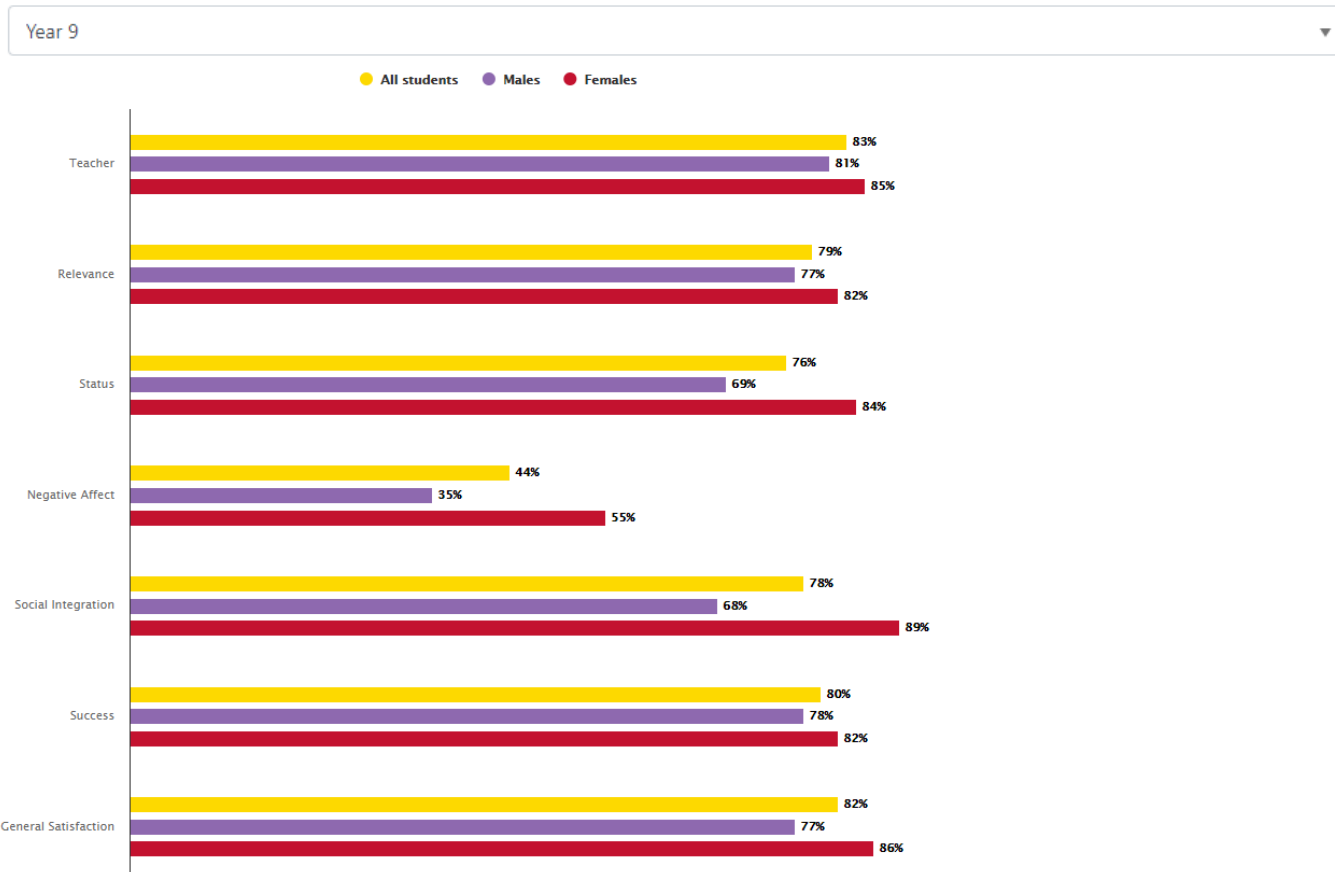

Results by domain

A method of summarising data collected on a four-point Likert scale like the SLQ, is to consider the average percentage agreement with a group of items belonging to a domain. For example, if the percentage of students agreeing or strongly agreeing with the six items making up the Teacher domain items were 91, 74, 77, 75, 78 and 69, the average percentage agreement for Teacher would be 77 percent. The following section provides the average percentage agreement for each domain.

Average percentage agreement for each domain



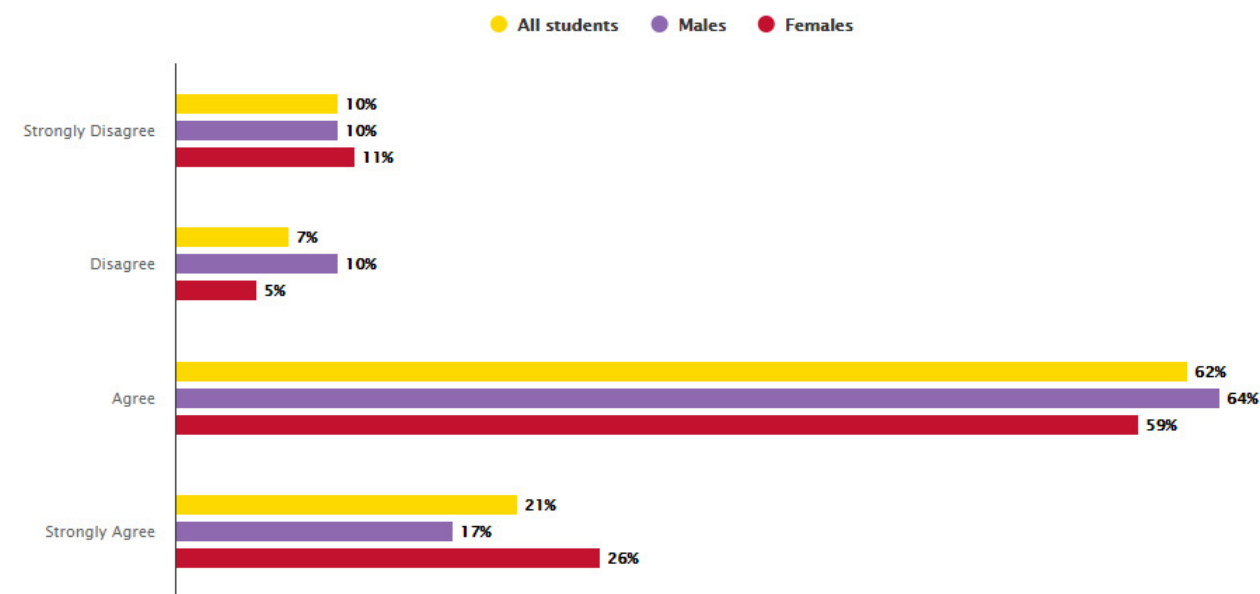
